Riddle

Question: Since it is unusual to be required to drink four cups of wine at a meal, why is that not one of the questions included in the Ma Nishtana as to why the Seder night is different?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: The Gemara in Pesachim 108a derives from a statement of Rav Nachman that two of the four cups of wine at the Seder must be drunk with heseiba (while reclining), but it is not known whether he referred to the first two or last two cups. The Gemara concludes that therefore we recline for all four cups. Why don't we apply the principle of sefeika d'Rabbanan l'kulah and not recline at all? (Note that reclining and the four cups are Rabbinic ordinances)

Answer: Ran explains that had we applied the rule of sefeika d'Rabbanan l'kulah, we would eliminate heseiba completely for the drinking of the four cups, but we know that Rav Nachman required it for two cups. Hence the rule is not applied.
