Riddle

Question: A "calendar match" is defined as a time when the first day of a civil calendar month coincides with the first day of a Jewish calendar month, the second with the second, etc. How is it possible to have 60 consecutive days of "calendar match"?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: This year, 5768, is both a leap year (shana m'uberet) and a Shmitta year. Before the advent of the fixed calendar, it was not possible to have both of those occurrences in the same year according to most Rishonim. Do you know why?

Answer: The Gemara (Sanhedrin 12a) forbids the declaration of a shana m'uberet in a Shmitta year because it would lengthen the prohibition against working the land and produce excess hardship. However, see Rambam, Hilchot Kiddush HaChodesh 4:16 for an exception to this rule.
