Riddle

Who was the Navi?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: How is it possible for a Jewish male to be a Levi when his father is not a Levi?

Answer: According to the Gemara in Bechorot, the child of a non-Jewish man and a Jewish woman who is the daughter of a Levi is a Levi. If the woman is the daughter of a Kohen, the child is neither a Kohen nor a Levi, but a Yisrael.
